

## **ABOUT CC LICENSES**

Creative Commons licenses give everyone from individual creators to large institutions a standardized way to grant the public permission to use their creative work under copyright law. From the user's perspective, the presence of a Creative Commons license on a copyrighted work answers the question: "What can I do with this work?"

Creative Commons licenses do not replace copyright. They are built to work with it.

The default of "all rights reserved" copyright means all rights to copy and adapt a work are reserved by the copyright holder. Creative Commons licenses adopt a "some rights reserved" approach, enabling an author or creator to free up their works for reuse by the public under certain conditions.

All Creative Commons licenses ensure that creators retain their copyright and get credit for their work, while permitting others to copy and distribute it.

## The CC License options

There are six different license types, listed from most to least permissive here:





This license enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, so long as attribution is given to the creator. This license allows for commercial use. CC BY includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.


<sup>1</sup> The creator is often, but not always, the copyright holder of the work. The copyright holder of the work is the legal entity who can openly license the work and receive attribution / credit when others use the work.



This license enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, so long as attribution is given to the creator. If you remix, adapt, or build upon the material, you must license the modified material under identical terms. This license allows for commercial use. CC BY-SA includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.







This license enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format for noncommercial purposes only, so long as attribution is giveto the creator. CC BY-NC includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.



NC: Only noncommercial uses of the work are permitted.

## CC BY-NC-SA



This license enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format for noncommercial purposes only, so long as attribution is given to the creator. If you remix, adapt, or build upon the material, you must license the modified material under identical terms. CC BY-NC-SA includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.



NC: Only noncommercial uses of the work are permitted.



SA: Adaptations must be shared under the same terms.



This license enables reusers to copy and distribute the material in any medium or format in unadapted form only, so long as attribution is given to the creator. The license allows for commercial use. CC BY-ND includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.



ND: No derivatives or adaptations of the work are permitted.



This license enables reusers to copy and distribute the material in any medium or format in unadapted form only, for noncommercial purposes only, so long as attribution is given to the creator. CC BY-NC-ND includes the following elements:



BY: credit must be given to the creator.



NC: Only noncommercial uses of the work are permitted.



ND: No derivatives or adaptations of the work are permitted.

# The CCO Public Domain Dedication O PUBLIC DOMAIN



CCO ("CC Zero") is a public domain dedication tool, which enables creators to give up their copyright and put their work into the worldwide public domain. CCO enables reusers to distribute, remix, adapt, and build upon the material in any medium or format, with no conditions.

## Choosing a license

The six licenses and the public domain dedication tool give creators a range of options. The best way to decide which CC legal tool is appropriate for you is to think about why you want to share your work, and how you hope others will use that work.

## Before licensing

Before you apply a CC license or CC0 to your work, there are some important things to consider.

## The CC licenses and CCO are irrevocable.

Once you apply a CC license to your work, or dedicate your work to the public domain, the public may continue to rely on that open license even if you stop distributing / sharing the open work.

## You must own or control copyright in the work before sharing.

Only the copyright holder, or someone with express permission from the copyright holder, can apply a CC license or CC0 to a copyrighted work. Please note this also applies to images (e.g. drawings, photos, graphs) within an openly licensed work. If you're using someone else's images in your own creative work, your copyright and your CC license only extends to your creative contributions; the underlying copyright / CC license conditions in the pre-existing images does not change.

## How to apply a CC license or CC0 to your work

CC licensing your work is simple. All you have to do is choose the CC license that suits your needs and then communicate this choice in a way that will be clear to people who come across your work. As part of this communication, you should include the title, author, source (URL) and license of the work.
